1) SSRIs = Selective Serotonin Reuptake Inhibitors, SNRIs = Serotonin and Norepinephrine Reuptake Inhibitors, TCAs = Tricyclic Antidepressants, MAOIs = Monoamine Oxidase Inhibitors

^These medications have anticholinergic side effects (i.e. dry mouth, blurred vision, constipation, etc.)
1) Amnesia - benzodiazepines have a side effect of anterograde amnesia (a lack of formation of memories) usually seen with higher doses
2) SS = serotonin syndrome

*All hypnotics can cause daytime drowsiness
^These medications have anticholinergic side effects (i.e. dry mouth, blurred vision, constipation, etc.)
1) These medications can cause complex sleep behaviors (i.e. sleep-driving, cooking or eating food, etc.)

valerian	insomnia	GI upset, insomnia, sedation
